WILD ALMONDS IN CALIFORNIA.—We were yester-
 day shown some wild almonds, found by Dr.
 Trask in the mountains of the Coast Range, in Santa
 Clara county. They are longer and wider than
 the common almond, but not so thick. Those
 shown us are an inch and a half long, an inch and
 a third wide, and half an inch thick. They are
 covered with a semi-fibrous coating that bears a
 great resemblance to a peach; and the tree and
 leaves resemble those of the peach in general ap-
 pearance and size. The peach and the almond are
 near botanical relatives. These wild almonds are
 of the hard-shell species. It is to be hoped that
 intelligent farmer or fruit-culturist will endeavor
 to ennoble this wild fruit, which may be of a valu-
 able species.—*Alta*.
