THE ROAD TO SAUCELITO.—One day last week
we passed over the road from this place to Saucel-
lito, and found it equal, if not superior, to any
other constructed road in the county. A vast
amount of work has been done to render the
route passable for vehicles, and it certainly is an
improvement in the right direction. Good roads
invite travel, and already many parties have
availed themselves of the facilities offered and
made the through trip from San Francisco to this
place via Saucelito. A stage now runs daily from
San Rafael to Saucelito, a distance of fifteen miles,
passing through Ross' Landing, Corte Madera and
Reed Rancho. At the landing of the Land and
Ferry Company is a fine wharf, and the lands ad-
jacent have been tastefully laid out for the especial
benefit of pleasure seekers. The steamer makes
four round trips daily. Altogether Saucelito is
looking up, and parties interested predict for it a
brilliant future.
