**A Suit on a Consul's Bond.**

The United States, by ex-United States Attorney John T. Carey, has appealed from the decision of the Circuit Court in a suit to recover \$213 18 on the bond of Samuel S. Foster, formerly Consul of the United States at Apia. It is claimed that Foster did not render an accounting for that sum, and the Government sued his bondsmen, Frederick Bee and William Bell. The District Court, in which the action was first brought, allowed the claim. On an appeal the Circuit Court reversed this decision, and the case is now before the Court of Appeals.
