

### **A Fine Vessel for Honolulu.**

A new vessel of 177 tons, recently constructed at Port Ludlow, Puget Sound, has been brought to this city and now lies at Fremont-street wharf receiving her engines. She will ply between the islands of the Hawaiian group. Her length is 120 feet, 26 feet beam and 10 feet depth of hold. She is schooner-rigged, and spreads a large amount of sail for a vessel of her size. She also has a compound engine, with cylinders 11 and 20 inches in diameter each, with a stroke of 18 inches. The propeller is 7½ feet in diameter. The hull is built of Oregon pine, iron-fastened, and the stern overhangs 9 feet. She is owned in Honolulu, and will be completed about the 20th of June, when, under a new Hawaiian name and papers, and commanded by Captain W. P. Godfrey, she will sail for the Sandwich Islands.

### **Juvenile Depravity.**

Marcella Columbia and Mary Avery, two girls neither of whom is yet 14 years of age, were arrested yesterday afternoon and charged with drunkenness. The young prisoners were seen by the arresting officers on the roof of a house on Jessie street, with a number of small boys, screaming and swearing at the top of their voices. The boys escaped on the approach of the officers, but the girls were caught and taken to the City Prison, where they were locked in the dark cells. This proceeding was found necessary as the round oaths which fell in a continuous stream from their lips were shocking in the extreme. The Avery girl, who is known among her companions as "Dick Turpin," is an incorrigible thief, and has been arrested several times heretofore for larceny.

### **Queen Victoria's Birthday.**

To-morrow evening many of the British residents of this city will celebrate Her Britannic Majesty's sixtieth birthday by a banquet at the Palace Hotel.
