Editor of Chinatown Paper Dies

Robert Leon Park, managing editor of the Chinese World and for nearly a half century colorful figure around the Hall of Justice, died Tuesday night at the San Francisco Hospital after an illness of seven months. He was 77.

The diminutive Mr. Park—he was 4½ feet high—was a master of Cantonese, Mandarin and a dozen other Chinese dialects. Some 40 years ago the then Police Judge Timothy I. Fitzpatrick named Park as the official Chinese interpreter at the Hall of Justice, a post he held until his death.

He became a newspaper reporter 50 years ago and rose to the managing editorship of the Chinese World. He had a colorful career.

When Louis Fook, houseboy, was accused of slaying his mistress in her California street apartment some years ago, Park suggested that reporters at the Hall try to get Fook to take the ancient Chinese oath of affirmation. A joss, or altar, was set up in City Prison and Fook, holding a freshly be-headed chicken, swore: "May the blood of my loved ones flow like this if I do not tell the truth." Park, hearing of the oath, predicted Fook would be acquitted. He was.

On motion of Assistant Public Defender Abe Dresow, the courts at the Hall adjourned yesterday in memory of Park.

He is survived by the widow, Laura, and a son, Dr. Frank Park, of Modesto.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 1 p. m. (location to be announced later) under the direction of Cathay (Wah Sang) Mortuary, 213 Powell street. Interment will follow at Greenlawn Cemetery, Lawndale. 11-28-31 SF CHRON.
